SESSION 1: 7 - 18 APRIL 2008

States under Review: Bahrain, Ecuador, Tunisia, Morocco, Indonesia, Finland, the United Kingdom, India, Brazil, the Philippines, Algeria, Poland, the Netherlands, South Africa, the Czech Republic, and Argentina.

I. PARTICIPATION: 7/16

During the first session of the UPR, Japan took the floor on 7 States under review (out of 16): Tunisia, Indonesia, Finland, the United Kingdom, Brazil, the Philippines and Poland.

II. STATEMENTS CLASSIFICATION

○ **By States individually**

Supporting or Neutral Statements: (6/7) - 85.7%

Japan made 6 supporting or neutral statements (out of the 7 statements made) for the reviews on Tunisia, Indonesia, Finland, the United Kingdom, Brazil, and the Philippines.

Critical Statements: (1/7) - 14.3%

Japan made 1 critical statement (out of the 7 statements made) for the review on Poland.

○ **By regional group**

Japan belongs to the Asian Group.

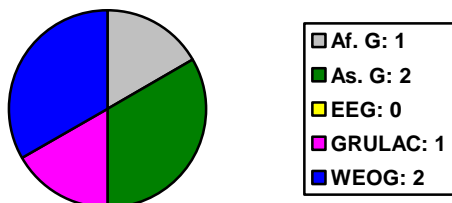

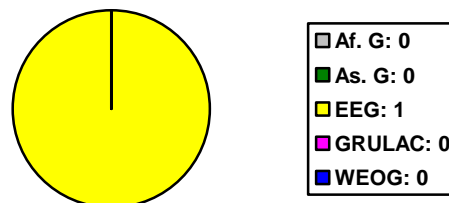

Japan made remarks on 7 States: Tunisia, Indonesia, Finland, the United Kingdom, Brazil, the Philippines, and Poland.

Concerns on human rights issues: (1/7) - 14.3%

Japan expressed concerns on 1 State: Poland.

Recommendations: (0/7) - 0%

Japan did not make recommendations on any State.
