Dear Mr. President,

The following statement has been prepared in partnership with Lambda Mozambique. Even

though we commend Mozambique for revising Articles 70 and 71 of the Penal Code, which

contained criminal provisions against those who were, and I quote, "usually engaging in acts

against nature", we cannot but hide our disappointment with the fact that the new penal code

does not include outlawing discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender

identity. Moreover, in both the first and the currenct cycle of UPR, Mozambique did not accept

any recommendation on SOGI, by which the State clearly shows it is not fully committed to the

rights of all human beings.

Mr. President,

Mozambique prides itself for having a democratic rule of law. But even though the constitution

guarantees equality of all before the law, and thus should prohibit discrimination on any

grounds and protect all its citizens, we still see too many human rights offences against

Mozambiquans based on sexual orientation and gender identity. Mozambique does still not

guarantee the freedom of association to organizations working on sexual minority rights. NGOs

are still not able to register and operate freely and receive the necessary legal protection to

guard against intimidation and violence from members of the public. We still witness violence

and discrimination against LGBT people.

We encourage Mozambique to keep up to its promise to uphold a democratic rule of law in

which non-disrcrimintation, protection and equality are guarenteed for all. We therefore call

upon the State to accept and act on all recommendations on sexual orientation and gender

identity in the current and past cycle of the UPR.
