Response of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Bahamas to its 141 recommendations

Neither have there been any formally reported case where anyone has alleged discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity. It should be noted that the Bahamas is generally supportive of efforts to combat all forms of discrimination against persons and to promote tolerance.

Neither have there been any formally reported case where anyone has alleged discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity. Persons who are in a same-sex relationship are able to avail themselves of the regular protection and remedies available under the law in respect to violence or assault of property rights.
