Issue 1: Stigma & Discrimination

Recommendation made only by Sweden in 2015 at the last Kenya review.

Recommendation was supported by the state but has not been implemented 5 years later.

Issue 1: Stigma & Discrimination

of LGBTQ+ persons have been insulted and denied SRH services by healthcare workers do to their sexual orientation or gender identity

Recommendations – Issue 1

Adopt a comprehensive and inclusive equality and nondiscrimination law that affords protection to all Kenyans regardless of their real or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.

Put in place a comprehensive legal and policy framework to protect and provide relevant services to transgender persons.

Issue 2: Punitive Laws

- Sections 162 a), c) & 165 of the Penal Code of Kenya still exists.
- Section 26 of the Sexual Offenses Act criminalises transmission and/or exposure to HIV.
- Sections 151, 153, 154, 155 of the Penal Code of Kenya are used to criminalise Sex Work.

Recommendations – Issue 2

Bring national legislation into conformity with Kenya's

International human rights obligations by aligning the Penal

Code of Kenya with the constitution.

Review all legal, policy and structural barriers that impede the provision of SRH Services among LGBTQ+ and other Key

Populations.
