

Institutional racism in the Netherlands



Institutional racism at the Dutch Tax Authority

- Applicants singled out based on (dual) nationality and/or immigration status
- Government has recognized the problem

Institutional racism requires a structural approach

- Regularly review legislation and policy
- Regularly review impacts on people of decision-making by public authorities

Human rights in the Caribbean Netherlands

Despite UPR-recommendations in 2017:

- Poverty rate remains alarming
- Gap in human rights protection between Caribbean and European Netherlands remains

Closing the gap in human rights protection and poverty can no longer be postponed



The housing crisis



Serious shortage of housing

 Deliberate phasing out of government involvement is counter to right to adequate housing

The government should:

- Prioritize (affordable) housing for all, in particular for those in disadvantaged positions
- Make haste with new law to force municipalities to accommodate asylum seekers

Agression and intimidation aimed at journalists and media personalities

- Penalize the sharing of personal data of journalists online (e.g. address)
- Allow the blocking of access to personal information in public records
