Housing is a fundamental human right and social need (Article 25.1 UDHR; Article 11.1 of ICESCR, UN OHCHR Fact Sheet 21)



Housing & Homelessness in Northern Ireland

- 44,400 applicants on the Social Housing waiting list
- Almost 24,000 Full Duty Applicants passed all four statutory tests for homelessness and who has not yet been given a permanent social tenancy
- 10,000 12,000 new Homeless Presenters each year
- 6,800 Children officially registered as homeless
- Close to 9,000 people living in Temporary Accommodation
- Nearly 40,000 households in Rent Arrears



Concerns

- Acute Housing Shortage
- Almost one third of homeless people are Families
- Greater demand for Temporary Accommodation
- More people in Rent Arrears
- Increase in Private Rental costs
- Issues of Addiction & Mental Health
- 100,000 'Hidden Homeless' (outside official figures)
- Impact of Covid-19
- Cost of Living Crisis



RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. The United Kingdom government addresses the issue of homelessness in Northern Ireland by ensuring the inclusion of a standalone housing and homelessness outcome in the Programme for Government for the NI Executive.
- 2. The Northern Ireland Housing Executive increase the supply of safe, secure and affordable housing to meet current need.
