IMPACTS

- 44,405 applicants on the Social Housing waiting list
- 23,634 Full Duty Applicants passed all four statutory tests for homelessness and who has not yet been given a permanent social tenancy
- 10,000 12,000 new Homeless Presenters each year
- 6,800 Children officially registered as homeless in 2021
- 8,497 people living in Temporary Accommodation
- 39,489 households in Rent Arrears
- 15 deaths of homeless young people between June & July 2022

RECOMMENDATIONS

We recommend that:

- 1. The UK government addresses the issue of homelessness in Northern Ireland by ensuring the inclusion of a standalone housing and homelessness outcome in the Programme for Government for the NI Executive.
- 2. The Northern Ireland Housing Executive increases the supply of safe, secure and affordable housing to meet current need.
