- Established in November 2001 under the National Human Rights Commission Act
- Independent national body to promote and protect human rights in South Korea
- Accredited A status by the GANHRI SCA
- Submitted its UPR report in July 2022 proposing 25 recommendations

Anti-discrimination Act (Equality Act)

Currently

- Absence of comprehensive anti-discrimination legislation
- Opposition from some religious or conservative groups
- Four Equality Bills pending at the National Assembly
- Legislation process delayed

Anti-discrimination Act (Equality Act t)

Recommendations

Develop the Government strategy for enacting the Equality Act

Pass the comprehensive Equality Act in an expeditious manner

 Establish policies and plans to eliminate discrimination and social prejudices against sexual minorities

Humain Rights Protection in the Military

Currently

- Violence, ill treatment, sexual assault and harassment in the military: long-standing social concerns in Korea
- High rate of suicide among military deaths
- The human rights protection system in the military may not function effectively.

Human Rights Protection in the Military

Recommendations

- Establish a transparent, fair and effective human rights investigation and remedial procedure in the military
- Prevent attempts to conceal the incidents of violence, retaliatory actions against reporters, and the victimization of the victims of abuses

 Identify the root causes of suicide in the military and intensify the effort to prevent suicide

Migrants in Vulnerable Situations

Currently

- Restriction on the freedom to choose/change workplaces of migrant workers
- The immigration 'protection' system functions as 'detention' in reality.
- Detainees in immigration detention facilities are occasionally at risk of abuses.

Migrants in Vulnerable Situation s

Recommendations

 Reduce or abolish the excessive restrictions on workplace changes of migrant workers, and support the migrant workers to seek their jobs freely

 Take measures for stronger human rights protection of migrants and foreigners in immigration detention
