Table 1: Tonga's working population

The total Tongan population in 2018 was 99,600 persons.

In 2018, the Tongan working-age population stood at 63,189, corresponding to 63.4 per cent of the total population.

The labour force is composed of the employed and the unemployed population, aged 15 years and above. In 2018, the Tongan labour force stood at 29,504 persons where 56.2 per cent were men and 43.8 per cent were women (Table 4.1 on the following page).

In 2018, the Tongan labour force participation rate stood at 46.7 per cent. Men have a higher labour force participation rate (56.2 per cent) than women (38.4 per cent), which holds for the age groups 15-24, 25-64 and 65+
