
# Human Trafficking Religious Freedom in Vietnam











- Fail to recognize migrant workers who became victims of human trafficking for forced labor exploitation;
- Fails to apply the non-punishment principle to victims of human trafficking;
- Lack of process and mechanism to identify and recognize victims of human trafficking.

### ISSUE 1: HUMAN TRAFFICKING Recommendations



- Ensure that all repatriated victims receive effective remedies and prosecute traffickers according to the Palermo Protocol.
- Issue a provision on protecting migrant workers who are vulnerable to becoming victims of human trafficking.
- Set up an entity specifically identify trafficked victims based on victim-centered approaches.

#### ISSUE 2 - Freedom of Religion



- Forced the H'mong to abandon their Christian faith
- Forced followers of unrecognized religions and members of unregistered religious groups to join statecontrolled/created religious organizations;
- Fail to recognize H'mong, and Montagnard as indigenous peoples.

### ISSUE 2 - Freedom of Religion Recommendations



- Review "the 2016 law on belief and religion" and bring it into conformity Article 18 of ICCPR;
- End the practice of forced renunciation and forced conversion of faith and sanction government officials as well as members of state-controlled religious organizations committing such violations
- Allow independent religious organizations to practice their religion without government interference.
