Adoption of the UPR Report on Azerbaijan

In an advance question, referring back to the recommendation it had made during the first cycle of the UPR, Slovenia asked, "How and when will the Government of Azerbaijan give practical effect to the Constitutional provision allowing conscientious objection to military service."

During the working group itself, Slovenia regretted the lack of information on this issue, but although it referred to the previous recommendation, this was not repeated.

As Slovenia had noted, Azerbaijan's constitution stipulates that "if serving in the armed forces runs counter to a person's convictions" an alternative service will be "prescribed by law". On accession to the Council of Europe in 2001, Azerbaijan undertook to promulgate the necessary legislation within two years. Ten years later, despite repeated reminders from the Council of Europe and recommendations from the Human Rights Committee, there are still no alternative service arrangements and in their absence over the years a number of conscientious objectors have been imprisoned for up to twelve months (of a possible two years) for their refusal of military service. As we have already mentioned in this Session of the Council, the two objectors who were
