

The institution of Cabo Verde is not yet accredited by the Global Alliance for National Human Rights Institutions (GANHRI) Sub-Committee on Accreditation.¹⁶ However, it has applied for accreditation and its application should be considered by the Sub-Committee in the second half of 2018. The Committee against Torture was concerned that the National Commission for Human Rights and Citizenship was not yet compliant with the Paris Principles. It recommended that Cabo Verde reinforce its independence, resources and infrastructure to enable it to fully execute its mandate.¹⁷
