

THE ROLE OF MEMBERS OF THE WORKING GROUP AT THE UPR

<u>UPR Stage:</u>	<u>Timeline:</u>	<u>What to do:</u>
<u>Before the Review</u>	Review (R) – 2 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attend UPR Info “pre-sessions”; • Meet with NGOs; • Submit written questions to the State under Review (SuR).
<u>During the Review</u>	R	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attend the review; • Ask questions to the SuR; • Make recommendations to the SuR.
<u>Adoption of the Report in the Working Group (WG)</u>	R + 3-5 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check the wording of its recommendations in the Report of the Working Group.
<u>After the adoption of the Report in the WG</u>	R + 2 weeks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check the correctness of the summary of its statement in the Report.
<u>Adoption of the Report at the Human Rights Council Session</u>	R + 3 to 4 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ask for clarifications to the SuR on its final responses to recommendations. • Raise concerns, if any, on the SuR responses.
<u>Between two Reviews</u>	R + 1 to 4,5 years	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monitor the implementation of the recommendations made; • Provide assistance to the Government and other actors such as NGOs;
