The above-mentioned report is the result of a comprehensive assessment and a national dialogue on the status of human rights. It addresses the follow-up of UPR recommendations as well as those made by other international human rights mechanisms, such as treaty bodies, special procedures, and the Interamerican bodies.

Our UPR implementation process is meant to complement and support the commitments derived from other international obligations. Rather than dividing these commitments by source, we have adopted a comprehensive and progressive approach, identifying priorities and measures to be taken to the benefit of the right holders, which is the final objective of any human rights exercise.

The faithful implementation of the UPR recommendations and international human rights obligations, in addition to the internal process of reflection and reform, has contributed to reinforce the coherence and effectiveness of our entire human rights system.
